

The district offers a wide variety of school choice and magnet programs, including International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, Visual and Performing Arts programs and a Young Marines program, the first of its kind in the U.S.

## STRONG COMMUNITY

12,000 students, parents, community members and business leaders participate in the district's Volunteer and Partnership Program. Volunteers provide more than 300,000 hours of service annually, with an estimated value of \$5 million.

Voters support additional school funding. A referendum passed with 77-percent support in 2014 and has passed every four years since 2002.
